



City of Phoenix Aviation Department Carbon Reduction Policy Statement

The City of Phoenix Aviation Department is committed to reducing carbon (i.e., greenhouse gas) emissions and advancing climate protection across Phoenix Sky Harbor International (PHX), Goodyear (GYR), and Deer Valley (DVT) airports. While airport infrastructure continues to grow, we recognize the ongoing potential to reduce emissions through energy efficiency, innovation and collaboration.

This policy affirms our commitment to achieving net zero carbon emissions from airport-controlled sources by 2040. We will lead reductions in areas under our direct control, guided by our Roadmap to Net Zero Carbon, and work to influence progress across third-party stakeholders who contribute over 90% of total airport-wide emissions.

In support of this effort, we will continue to participate in the Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) program, the industry's only global, airport-specific carbon certification program. The ACA program provides a third-party verified framework to ensure accountability, transparency and continuous improvement in carbon management.

This policy guides our work across the Aviation Department and aligns with the City of Phoenix climate action goals. The policy will be shared with staff, the airport community and the public to promote transparency and support collective action toward climate protection.
