Airport Jobs

Pilot – Person who is trained and certified to control the flight of an aircraft.



Aircraft Rescue and Firefighter – Firefighters involved in emergency response and rescue of passengers and airplane crews involved in aviation incidents and accidents.



Mechanic – Skilled technician who uses tools, to build, maintain, or repair machinery including automotive vehicles and aircraft.



Tug or Pushback Operator – One who operates a special vehicle to move an airplane away from the airport gate as part of a flight departure.



Concessionaire – Operator of an airport restaurant, shop, or services provider.



Navigator – A volunteer that provides airport customers with directions, information, and friendly assistance for optimal customer service.



Air Traffic Controller – Manage airport traffic by guiding aircraft pilots safely from taxi to takeoff, during flight, and landings.



Airport Security Screener – Work at airport security checkpoints to perform passenger screening and baggage monitoring through x-ray machines to prevent dangerous and illegal items from flights.




Air Cargo Handler – Specializes in loading, staging, and unloading cargo on airplanes.



Flight Attendant – Airline staff that ensures passenger safety and flight deck security, including providing beverage and food service, helping with passenger comfort, and assisting in emergencies.



Aircraft Fueler – Fuels aircraft, manages fuel transactions, and safely operates fueling equipment.



Preparator (Airport Museum) - Designs art exhibition layouts, installs artwork, and some wood working or welding.
