CERTIFICATION STATS



- 702 firms currently certified with the City of Phoenix
- For FFY 2022-2023 PHX generated a total of \$96,710,720 in gross sales to ACDBE certified firms
- There were 77 occurrences where ACDBE certified firms participated in contracts at PHX
- Total of 32.86% of total gross sales going to certified firms



What is Business Certification?

- <u>Purpose</u>: "Ensure that only firms that fully meet this part's eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs, SBEs or ACDBEs in the case of concessions"
- > The criteria for certification is set forth in:
 - Chapter 18 of the Phoenix City Code Ordinance (SBEs)
 - 49 Code of Federal Regulations (eCFR) Parts 23 ACDBE and Part 26 –
 DBF
- Certification applies to the owner(s) of the business
- Certification is not transferable
- Certification is a marketing tool, used to enhance your
- to do business in public markets.



Three Types of Certification offered by the City of Phoenix

Small Business Enterprise Program (SBE) Certification

- Local program
- Opportunities to do business with the City of Phoenix
- Applicable to procurement and contracting that occurs using City funds
- Only available to firms with a primary or principal location in Maricopa County

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE) Certification

- Federal Program
- Applicable to USDOT-funded contracts administered by the City or its subrecipients (surrounding 15 cities, Valley Metro and state-wide)
- Available to firms located throughout the U.S. and completed the DBE process with the City of Phoenix, ADOT, or City of Tucson

Airport Concessions
Disadvantaged Business
Enterprise Program (ACDBE)
Certification

- Federal Program
- Applicable to firms owned and operated by disadvantaged individuals in an airport concessions environment on FAA-assisted contracts and procurements
- This program applies to all contracts financed in whole or in part by the Federal Aviation Administration

Experience and Expertise	Owners must have the experience, expertise, and control of the day-to-day operations of the firm

- Reduces paper
- Increased security
- Work on application and save your progress

The application includes:

- Basic Application for Certification
- Affidavit of Certification
- Supporting Documents Checklist
- Personal Net Worth Statement

Application Process


The application review

- Takes up to 90 days to complete
- DBE and ACDBE application require onsite visits

Once Certified

- Firm will appear in the certified directory
- Certifications don't expire
- Annual updates must be submitted yearly

Monitoring ACDBE participation



- Review small business requirements documentation submitted with RCS
 - Work in collaboration with the Airport team to set solicitation outreach requirements
 - In accordance with 49 CFR part 23 we review bid submittals to ensure compliance with Small Business Outreach requirements

Monitoring ACDBE participation

Monitor Joint Ventures that have ACDBE firms

- Joint Venture definition
- Review and Approve Joint Ventures with ACDBEs
- Conduct on-site interviews once a year
- Conduct desk reviews on the anniversary of approval of joir ventures
- Review monthly gross sales figures entered by the Prime Concessionaires and ACDBEs
- Resolve discrepancies as they arise



Track and monitor ACDBE participation throughout the year

- Ensure PHX is meeting ACDBE goal proposed to the FAA
- Triennial goal is submitted to the FAA every 3 years
- Submit Uniform Report to the FAA on a yearly basis
