


MEETING MATERIALS

FORM:

What will the Cultural Corridor look like?

PURPOSE

Help us identify what physical forms should be used to communicate your community's culture

WHAT IS "FORM"?

"Form" describes the physical markers that are used to communicate your community's cultural stories and history.

Form is broken down into three categories: Gold, Silver, and Bronze. These categories have been identified based on their associated cost, scale, and impact on your community.

GOLD

These are large-scale ideas that are the **most costly** and **most ambitious** to implement.

SILVER

Medium-scale ideas that are **somewhat costly** and **moderately challenging** to implement.

BRONZE

Small-scale ideas that are the **most affordable** and **easiest** to implement.



Identify Your Places of Heritage/ Memories

WHAT ARE PLACES THAT DESERVE "CELEBRATION"?

- Preferred Spark Area 2 appears to have a diagonal pedestrian walkway
 - Recommends multiple cultural displays along this walkway in the form of:
 - » Statues
 - » Murals
 - » Water Fountains
 - » Art Displays, etc.
 - » Each with a plaque explaining cultural significance
- Likes the idea of using the small stone house on CPLC property for an audiovisual museum
 - Monitor presents 15 minute historical perspective on the area
 - Walls lined with historical photos
- Capture a verbal history from elderly residents
 - $\,{}^{\circ}\,$ Verbal history/reflections would be part of the AV presentation
 - Production estimate cost \$25,000-\$50,000
















This is a great example of audio tales and a cultural plaque, located in Selma, Alabama. Try it out and discover how it works!


