

Scope of Work

Make sure you are submitting for the correct solicitation

Review all plans and specifications

Visit the site

Seek
clarification
with the
"Procurement
Officer"

Factor in all your cost



Contract Surety Obligations

Bid Bonds guarantees the low bidder will enter into a contract with the owner and provide final performance and payment bonds

Performance Bonds

guarantees that the contractor will perform all specifications of the contract

Payment Bonds

guarantees to third parties that all labor and material suppliers will be paid

Maintenance Bonds

warrants that faulty workmanship and defective materials will be corrected









Badging & Background

AVIATION SECURITY PROCEDURES

- Contractor & Subcontractor subject to screening.
- Contractor & Subcontractor will not be allowed on PHX property without a city issued badge.
- Screening and badge cost will be at the expense of the contractor.

> Standard limits for most contracts:

General Liability, Auto Liability Limits = \$1,000,000 per

occurrence / \$2,000,000 aggregate

Workers' Compensation/Employers Liability

Statutory Work Comp Employers Liability

Each Accident \$100,000

Disease – Each Employee \$100,000

Disease - Policy Limit \$500,000

Higher limits may be required for more hazardous operations (i.e. activities / services on airside of an airport)
